Grant Dollars in Action Carol City Middle School Receives Innovative Space Media Center

The partnership between Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS), the 2021 College Football Playoff National Championship Game Host Committee (CFPNCG) and the College Football Playoff Foundation has transformed Carol City Middle School's media center into a new, technology-rich innovative space. This transformation is part of a \$2 million dollar partnership between the three entities in support of the District's Middle School Redesign (MSR) initiative, intended to meet the unique social, emotional, and academic needs of teachers and their students.

Unveiling of the school's new virtual reality equipment, Promethean board, robotics section and more than a dozen computer stations was held on September 13, 2021, along with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Carol City is one of 16 Miami-Dade public middle schools having its media centers converted. The partners will continue to unveil new projects throughout the year in support of the District's MSR initiative.

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Florida City Elementary School's Media Specialist receives \$2,000 Grant for Pioneering Reading Program

Last month, Voya Financial, Inc., awarded a \$2,000 grant to Florida City Elementary Media Specialist, Ms. Jill Daceus, as part of the company's 2021 Unsung Heroes awards competition.

The Voya Foundation has awarded more than \$5.8 million in support of educators through this nationwide program and Ms. Daceus was commended for her efforts on producing a grant proposal that reflected a creative way to reach students and help them stay engaged in learning during these challenging times.

"We 'AR' Reading Ninjas," is the innovative literacy initiative that Ms. Daceus proposed, and it will be implemented in this current school year.



The Voya grant will be used to purchase the Accelerated Reader (AR) computer program that helps develop students' reading skills. Ms. Daceus is very excited to see AR come back to Florida City Elementary School and hopes that students will cultivate a love for reading by being incentivized and celebrated for reaching literacy goals.

The Florida City Elementary Voya grant is the only winning program in the state of Florida and was selected from a group of applicants from across the United States. In addition to receiving the \$2,000 award to help fund and bring her program to life, Ms. Daceus will now compete with other finalists for one of the top three prizes, an additional \$5,000, \$10,000 or \$25,000 from Voya Financial.
