Miami-Dade County Public STEM Schools Partner With The Arts

Miami-Dade County Public Schools' (M-DCPS) Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) school designation now has a partner with the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) designation. To meet STEM and STEAM school designation criteria, schools must have special competitions, teachers professional development, community partnerships, equity and accountability. A STEM and/or STEAM school designation also strengthens science, mathematics, the visual/performing arts, accelerated studies and career and technical offerings.

Schools that meet the designations will be promoted to the community to ensure all stakeholders are aware of the great choices M-DCPS offers in the areas of STEM and STEAM education. Schools receive distinct designation levels (Bronze, Silver and Gold) so as to encourage growth and performance in the areas of STEM and STEAM.

Note: **Post-Award Training Sessions** are **required** for all grant program managers each fiscal year.



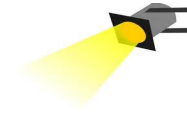
M-DCPS Chosen To Participate In Sprints’s 1 Million Project Donation

Sprint’s 1 Million Project helps to “level the playing field” by providing free devices and wireless service to students who do not have home Internet access. This much needed technology and corresponding service will allow many more students to participate in the digital world and reach their full potential to succeed in school.

Participating students will receive phones and tablets along with free service for all active devices. All M-DCPS high schools will receive a portion of the total number of devices and corresponding service based on the number and percentage of free and reduced-price lunch recipients on campus. Sprint’s project will serve more than 46,000 of our students over a five-year period.

Miami-Dade County Public Schools Secures Number One Spot In the Nation for the United Way Campaign

On February 22, Miami-Dade County Public Schools celebrated the #1 United Way school system campaign in the Nation. Students raised \$616,557, \$95,000 more than last year, and employees raised \$896,595. This is a grand total of \$1,513,153 for our community. M-DCPS is also proud of our 6,478 Loyal Contributors, donors to United Way for 10 years or more. Eleven work locations raise over \$10,000!

Via social media our schools shared how they lived united for a stronger Miami through education, financial stability and health. The schools with the most interaction received a \$250 gift card. We congratulate Hialeah Gardens Elementary, Redland Middle School and Miami Lakes Educational Center. The big winners for the day were our Grand Champions; Hialeah Adult Education for the school site employee campaign, Information Technology Service – non-school site, and the student of North Dade Center for Modern Languages. This once again exemplifies the generosity, commitment and care our staff and students have to making a stronger Miami.

United Way is a year round partnership that provides over 10 million dollars to programs that operate in our schools. Programs such as; City Year Miami's Whole School Child at Redland Middle School serves 366 students with an investment of \$100,000, Communities in Schools- Bridges to Graduation and Beyond at Carol City Senior High School serving 92 students with an investment of \$62,000. Overtown Youth Center EWRS Youth Development at Booker T. Sr. High and Jose De Diego Middle serving 166 students with an investment of \$50,000. NCTM Prospective Middle School Mathematics Teacher Course Work Scholarships

The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial support to college or university students who are preparing to teach middle school mathematics. For the 2017-18 school year, one scholarship will be awarded to a person currently completing their junior year of college or university, scheduling for full-time study at a four- or five-year college or university in the next academic year, and pursuing a career goal of becoming a certified teacher of middle school mathematics. Scholarship funds can be applied to tuition, fees, course materials, and other expenses directly related to the recipient's academic program of study. Coursework and graduation must be completed between April 1, 2018 and August 31, 2019.
